SHAKESPEARE WEEK

The week commencing Monday 14th March is national Shakespeare Week - an event being celebrated by Birklands and over 10,000 other schools across the country. This year is the 400th anniversary of the death of William Shakespeare and Shakespeare Week introduces primary aged children to Shakespeare's life, works and times in a fun and engaging way. All pupils will be finding out about William Shakespeare through an assembly and the Y3/4 performance of 'Shakespeare Rocks!' and will also be given a 'Passport to Shakespeare' to bring home with them.

Tickets are still available at the school office for the performances to be held on Tuesday at 1.30pm and Wednesday at 5.30pm.

School Meal Increase

We have been advised by Nottinghamshire County Council that the price of a school meal will increase with effect from 11th April (after the Easter holidays) to £2.25. If you pay through your sQuid account, this will be adjusted automatically and you don't need to do anything. Funding for School

As you know, all of the children in Key Stage I now qualify for Universal Infant Free School Meals. This has meant that many parents who may qualify for Free School Meals do not apply as they already receive a free meal for their child. However, many funding streams that we can access as a school use the Free School Meal indicator as a way to allocate funding. As fewer parents now apply, this means we are able to access less funding. We are keen to keep our current staffing ratios for classes but as costs increase, we need to tap into as much funding as we can.
