School Crossing

We have been advised by Nottinghamshire County Council that there will be no school crossing at the junction of High Street and Sherwood Street until further notice due to illness. Please be aware of this if your children normally cross at this junction.

Non - Uniform Day

There is currently only one defibrillator accessible in Warsop and is situated at the fire station, unfortunately this isn't enough to cover the whole of Warsop.

Defibrillators are an extremely vital piece of equipment used by all emergency services.

They are used when a patient suddenly goes into cardiac arrest and their heart stops suddenly without warning.

A cardiac arrest can happen to anyone, of any age, and can happen anytime, at any place with no warning. Please help us to support this important fundraiser by sending you child with £1 on Thursday. There is also a 'Just Giving' page under the name 'help raise funds for more defibrillators for Warsop and local schools' Thank you.

Road Safety

Please be aware that after the half term break a camera car will be patrolling around school to help address the problem of cars parking on zig zags/double yellow lines. The car will be using Automatic Number Plate Recognition technology to capture any car parking contraventions. Please note that motorists caught parking on restricted areas near schools or in bus stops will be issued with a Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) of £70.
