

when you hear the whistle, queue up at the bottom of the steps with the rest of Kingfisher.




Follow the one-way system up stairs and go through these doors.

The Battle of Britain.




Cooking and nutrition.

In Y5, you may wish to walk home from school on your own. However, your parent/carer must inform the school office that they give consent for you to do so.




Other key facts and reminders:
